Olympiapark Munich: Conceptualising a Conservation Management Plan

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Call for Applications

The International Council on Monuments and Sites' Emerging Professionals Working Group (ICOMOS EPWG), with the support of the EPWG Portugal and Belgium and ICOMOS University Forum, is delighted to announce the EPWG Summer School dedicated to young professionals in the field of heritage conservation from **4 September until 7 September at TU Munich**.

The 2025 Summer School will shine the spotlight on the renowned **Olympic Centre in Munich**. Now included on Germany's Tentative List for World Heritage designation, the Olympic Park presents a complex challenge for conservation, as it encompasses a multiplicity of physical and intangible values and involves various stakeholders: the city, residents, professionals, and visitors. The park is a unique recreational space for leisure and culture, a hub for different social and sports events. Simultaneously, it features an exceptional landscape and architectural design, crowned by the distinctive tent-like structure. A values-based approach is crucial for conserving the complex, whereas an appropriate Conservation Management Plan must be set up.

The 2025 Summer School will bring students and young professionals to discover diverse aspects of CMP, focusing on the Olympic Park in Munich. Continuing with the successful format of the previous events, the School will occur between 4 September and 7 September, encompassing four inspiring days. A guided tour will let the participants discover the Olympic Park, delving into the place's rich history on Day 1. Day 2 will feature an open-day forum, with esteemed speakers from various backgrounds sharing invaluable insights on the intricacies of the Olympic Park in particular, as well as the broader context of conserving such complex objects. The final days will culminate the program with a dynamic workshop for students and young professionals, where they will investigate the concept of the Conservation Management Plan, analyse the object and explore the multifaceted values of the Olympic Complex.

We welcome applications from emerging professionals and students from disciplines such as architecture, conservation, urbanism, art history, and related fields. Applicants of all nationalities and ages are invited to apply.

Please note that travel, accommodation, and meals are NOT covered by the organizers. Snacks and drinks will be provided throughout the workshop.

Participation is free of charge.

The working language will be English. The summer school will be limited to 20 participants, selected based on their applications. The application link is the following:
