

Christoph Machat, PhD, honorary doctor's degrees from two universities; born 1946 in Sighisoara/Transylvania/Romania. Studies in history of art, archaeology, museology and comparative literary studies at the University of Fine Arts Bucharest and the University of Cologne (PhD). As of 1972 working in monument conservation, first as district officer for the State Conservation Office of Romania, Bucharest, as of 1973 in Germany: initially working for the Bavarian State Conservation Office, Munich; 1980–2011 for the State Conservation Office of the Rhineland, head department of inventories/lists of monuments. Several books and articles on art history and monument conservation; editor of the series *Topography of Historical Monuments in the Rhineland*, *Topography of Historical Monuments of Transylvania*, *Cultural Monuments of Transylvania*. Since 1980 teaching activities at the Universities of Cologne and Bonn, at ICCROM Rome (1994–1996), the University of Architecture “Ion Mincu” in Bucharest, since 1998 associate professor of history and theory of conservation at the University Babes-Bolyai in Cluj Napoca, Romania. Member of several scientific societies; 1992–2013 chairman of the Cultural Council of the Transylvanian Saxons in Germany; honorary member of the Romanian National Commission for Historic Monuments. Several awards and distinctions (e.g. 2004 Andras Möller Medal of ICOMOS Hungary, 2005 Europa Nostra Main Award for the Conservation of the Church on the Hill in Sighisoara/Romania, 2009 Georg Dehio Main Award, 2014 Main Award for Culture of the Transylvanian Saxons). Since 1978 member of ICOMOS, honorary member of CIAV (International Committee on Vernacular Architecture), 1992–1995 Secretary General of CIAV, 1995–2005 President of CIAV; co-author of the ICOMOS “Charter on the Built Vernacular Heritage” (Mexico 1999). Several evaluation and monitoring missions for the UNESCO World Heritage List. 2000–2009 and again since 2012 Vice President of ICOMOS Germany. Member of the German Preventive Monitoring Group. Since 2008 member of the Executive Committee of ICOMOS; also member of the World Heritage Working Group and the World Heritage Panel. Since 2010 responsible for the editing of the ICOMOS Heritage at Risk publication series.
